*Stated within the International Plumbing Code (IPC) and Uniform Plumbing Code – “**the fixtures shall conform in quality and design to nationally recognized applicable standards included in ASME A112.19.3**” for stainless steel. Therefore, the below reference to ASME A112.19.3 standard does apply in the codes. I have attached the following references from the CSA standards indicating by the standards committees that a customer shall have at the very least the manufacturer’s name and model number on the stainless steel plumbing fixtures. It is highly recommended by CSA that if a product is certified that the CSA mark is applied otherwise the manufacturer will have to produce documentation proving that the product is certified by a reputable standards organization. The burden of proof lies with the manufacturer if the CSA mark is not applied. Accordingly if a product is certified by a standards organization then all of the standards organizations suggest their mark as well on the certified product.*

According to ASME A112.19.3-2008/CSA B45.4-08 the following is the marking requirements for sinks.

6 Markings, packaging, and installation instructions and other literature

6.1 General

6.1.1

Stainless steel plumbing fixtures shall be marked with the manufacturer’s name or registered trademark or, in the case of private labeling, the name of the customer for whom the fixture was manufactured. Additional markings shall be in accordance with [Clauses 6.2](#) and [6.3](#), as applicable.

6.1.2

Markings shall be permanent, legible, and visible after installation.

6.5.2.1

Packaging for stainless steel fixtures shall be marked with the

- (a) manufacturer’s name or registered trademark or, in the case of private labeling, the name of the customer for whom the fixture was manufactured; and
- (b) model number.
